
SAVE THE MANGROVE ECOSYSTEM! JUPITER NARROWS CONSERVATION ALLIANCE

Survey Area/Focus



Our progress

- Received a generous donation from the VoLo Foundation in PBG.
- Partnered with Ocean Conservancy who is leading the project with us. As the longest operating non-profit dedicated to ocean conservation, they bring tremendous science-based knowledge and experience to this project.
- Hired Taylor Engineering to 1) conduct a natural resources survey, and 2) prepare conceptual designs and have pre-permitting conversations in February/March.
- Established Jupiter Narrows Conservation Alliance as a Florida nonprofit corporation with 501c3 status pending.

Takeaways from Natural Resources Survey

- Extensive seagrass beds within survey area 5 species found
- 3 of the 4 mangrove islands have experienced substantial erosion and may risk total loss without intervention
- Very high energy environment (boat wakes, wind-generated waves, tidal currents) likely cause of mangrove habitat deterioration
- Implementing wave attenuating structures could benefit mangrove and seagrass communities by reducing erosional forces and stabilizing sediments
- Opportunities exist for a habitat stabilization/restoration project
